"Your peace will rest on that family"

Thursday 18th March John 5:31-47 "You place your hopes on Moses but Moses will be your accuser".

Friday 19th March Feast of St Joseph Matthew 1:16-24 "How Jesus Christ came to be born"

Saturday 20th March John 7:40-52 "The law does not allow us to pass judgement without hearing the accused".
