Homíly Notes

This is an icon painted by Andre Rublev, a Russian artist of the 15th century.

It depicts the three angels who visited Abraham at the oak of Mamre, in the book of Genesis. The icon is understood as a representation of the Holy Trinity

We believe that God is one, in

three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Look at the faces, they are similar, also the figures are similar, meaning that they all share the same divinity.

The three are sitting around a table with a cup in the middle. These are sign of fellowship, of communion, of love. Saint John writes: God is Love.

The love of God is directed not only inwardly; God's love reaches out towards God's people and the whole of God's creation. In the Gospel we read: God loved the world so much, that he gave his only Son.

In the icon, there is a free space at the table. In the Gospel we read: everyone who believes in the Son, may have eternal life. In other words, we are invited to sit at the table, to share in the life of God. Everyone who puts his trust in Jesus, will share in the life of God, will find a place at the table and in the heart of God.

When we hear eternal life, what do we think of? Is it the life we have here on earth, but then everlasting? No, eternal life is the life of the Trinity, which God wishes to share with us.

This life is promised to us and at the same time, already given to us, here and now!

Already now, God wishes to lift us up, out of despair and emptiness, out of the irrationality of war and violence and make us sharers of his love and life.

Sunday Thoughts

Bishop Varghese Thottamkara from Ethiopia has made a heartfelt appeal for peace talks to resume between the government and rebel forces in order to end a deadly conflict that has resulted in numerous casualties and displaced tens of thousands of people.

Bishop Thottamkara, Vicar Apostolic of Nekemte, expressed the desperate

need for peace between the government and rebel groups, particularly the Oromo and Gumuz ethnic tribes. The bishop emphasised the severe consequences of the conflict, including mass displacement, frequent kidnappings for ransom, and imposed curfews.

He called on both sides to prioritise the well-being of the people and suggested the reintegration of rebels into the police, army, and society. The bishop shared the challenges faced by his own diocese, with a significant number of churches being forced to close for security reasons.

He highlighted the danger faced by priests and Sisters, who have been abducted and had to abandon their parishes. The bishop expressed gratitude to Aid to the Church in Need for its support in training catechists and funding the needs of the impoverished and persecuted clergy.
