# Homíly Notes

The verse: "Longing for light we wait in darkness" in

Bernadette Farrel's song is an idea that captures well the anticipation of consolation amidst the experiences of darkness. A longing for light can be the longing for justice and for peace that the Messiah offers.

The prophecy of Isaiah in the first reading was made to Israel in a context of exile in Babylon. People were weary with suffering, and they anticipated peace and the return to their homeland. Isaiah prophesized that the time of exile is over, and that God will make a way back home to Jerusalem across the desert. It was to be like a new exodus.

While the Roman emperors held that they had brought peace and justice through violence and coercive power, as Wright points out, the lived experience of the majority under the Roman rule at the time of Jesus was far from an experience of justice and of peace. There were widespread social tensions, experiences of failed kings and leaderships, of lost sovereignty, and of religious persecution. People longed for a religious and political renewal. It is in this context that the good news of Jesus begins with John the Baptist. John is the one to "make a straight highway for our God across the desert." The highway meant here is one that leads to hearts and minds, and one which includes repentance and renewal. It is a highway with a different vision of bringing about justice and peace to people who live in darkness of suffering and death. Through his birth, his words, deeds, and even his death and resurrection, Jesus unveils this new vision which constitutes the good news. It is this vision of Jesus that his followers continually search for and try to live by especially in troubled times. Here we may remember the document entitled *Peace on Earth* by Pope John XXIII which marks 60 years this year.

Our prayers accompany those in intense suffering and who long for the end to pain, estrangement, and violence. *Fr. Charles*

# 11TH AND 12TH DECEMBER: FINAL NEGOTIATIONS. COP 28

(LAUDATE DEUM, 60) May those

taking part in the Conference be strategists capable of considering the common good and the future of their children, more than the short-term interests of certain countries or businesses. In this way, may they demonstrate the nobility of politics and not its shame. To the powerful, I can only repeat this question: 'What would induce anyone, at this stage, to hold on to power, only to be remembered for their inability to take action when it was urgent and necessary to do so?'''

(LAUDATO DEUM, 54) "If we are confident in the capacity of human beings to transcend their petty interests and to think in bigger terms, we can keep hoping that COP28 will allow for a decisive acceleration of energy transition, with effective commitments subject to ongoing monitoring. This Conference can represent a change of direction, showing that everything done since 1992 was in fact serious and worth the effort, or else it will be a great disappointment and jeopardise whatever good has been achieved thus far."

The Pope dared to communicate his ambitious expectations towards COP28. Hundreds of NGOs, representatives of poor countries suffering from the consequences of the climate catastrophe, and many activists from all around the world did the same. Let us join their hope and accompany these last two days of negotiations with our prayer. Not because of blind optimism, but out of lucid, active, and others-centred hope. I believe that our love and hope will bear fruit, even if the crucifixion of creation will still go on for a while. Conversion is always possible. A prophetic existence is always possible. And shouldn't the role of, us, Christians be to keep open and gently widen the possible, because we live out of faith and out of the belief that in Jesus' resurrection, the impossible once surprisingly became possible?
