



Eíd al-Adha

Very best wishes to you and the whole community for a Blessed and Happy Eid al-Adha May the Almighty and Merciful One grant each one of you the strength to imitate Ibrahim in his heartfelt submission to the will of God. This is the message we sent to the Mosques of Merseyside and Birkenhead on the occasion of the Celebration of Eid al-Adha, the second most important annual feast of our Muslim Brothers and Sisters.

It comes at the end of the annual Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca, which takes place in the last month of the lunar year and which all Muslims are expected to make at least once during their lifetime if they can afford to do so. It is one of the Five Pillars of Islam.

Eid al-Adha commemorates Abraham's (the Prophet Ibrahim) devotion to God and his readiness to sacrifice Isaac (Ismail) as a sign of his trust in and obedience to God. Eid al-Adha means "the festival of sacrifice". This act of sacrifice of a domestic animal is called Qurbani. In the UK, it is performed in licenced abattoirs and the meat brought to the mosque after the prayer of the gathered community of the faithful.

This meat is divided into 3 parts: one for the family, one for friends of the family and the third is given for distribution to those in need. The day is spent feasting with family and friends, often wearing new or best clothes and sharing gifts.

Though we are bound by a common heritage and destiny, living peacefully as a human family is a challenge. In *Luke 10:25-37*, we read about the good Samaritan, a parable that inspires our visions of how to live together. Pope Francis has for instance used this parable well in his teaching about Fraternity and Social relationships.

Reflecting on this Parable brings to our awareness the fact that our spaces and social interactions are not lacking good Samaritans. Although we can identify examples of those who do harm, and those who are indifferent to a "wounded stranger on the road," we acknowledge with gratitude the fact that we have good Samaritans. For example, it is the good Samaritans who ensure that about 150 food parcels are given out to the needy on weekly basis here at St Vincent's Parish, it is the good Samaritans who opened their houses to Ukrainian refugees, and it is also the good Samaritans who are in the movements that advocate for right relationships within nations, among nations, and relationship right between people and environment. But while we get a sense of affirmation of participating in the spirit of the good Samaritan (an affirmation of being and doing good), we are awakened to the following: that the imitation of the Samaritan as Jesus commands us; "Go and do the same," is a reality that we reach though imperfectly. For as we heard in Dt. 30:11-14, "the law of the Lord is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach". But at the same time, it also remains always ahead of us, calling us and challenging us. This command of Jesus is always presenting us with a profound question; "How, over a lifetime, do we continually grow in the ability to become a neighbour?" A good Samaritan?
