Advent Thoughts Maranatha!

Homily Notes

The question of John the Baptist to Jesus in today's Gospel is somewhat strange: '*Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else*'?

It is strange, because in last week's Gospel, we listened to John the Baptist announcing that the arrival of the Messiah was close at hand. John is doubting because his expectation of the Messiah was quite different from what he hears about Jesus.

John was expecting the Messiah to be tough and merciless, an agent of God's wrath and retribution. Someone who would get rid of the 'bad guys'.

And here is Jesus, sitting down for a meal with the 'bad guys', forgiving those who crucified him, healing the weak and the wounded; preaching about the compassionate Father, who patiently waits for his children to return home.

How different is Jesus from John's expectation!

Jesus sends John's disciples back: tell John what you hear and see. I am the One. You were right. But in your expectation of the Messiah, you were wrong. *You need to make a switch*.

We too need to make a switch, because from time to time we all have an image of God as John did; a God who punishes the bad and rewards the good. We need to change to the God of Jesus, his heavenly Father, who does not pay evil with evil, but who waits patiently for his children and then forgives and welcomes them with joy.

And sometimes people need change in the way they relate with others in their families, street, parish community and wider world.

At times people think in terms of punishing others, by their silence, by their distance or by violent measures. As disciples of the Kingdom, Advent is the appropriate time for getting together again, for reconciliation and forgiveness. *Ferdinand* Maranatha! Open our eyes to the dignity of all people And our ears to the cries of the earth. Maranatha! Let us walk in solidarity with the poor And cleanse our world from oppression. Maranatha! Let us shout out for justice for all

Let us shoul out for fustice for al And renew our hope for change. Maranatha! The Lord is coming Let us share the Good News! Amen.

"Recognition of human dignity is the first principle which must underpin our asylum policy. A hostile environment is an immoral environment. Each human being has an inherent and immeasurable worth, regardless of their status, wealth, heritage or background".

"Care for the stranger has long been embedded in societies of Christian and Jewish roots and of other faiths right round the world. The welcome arrival in the UK of other religious faiths has deepened those traditions of compassion".

"A compassionate asylum system is one that sees the faces of those in need and listens to their voices".

"A compassionate policy is one that has confidence to reject the shrill narratives that all who come to us for help should be treated as liars, scroungers or less than fully human". *The Baptism* of Isabel Anderson, daughter of Eva Anderson, of Exchange Street, will take place at 12 noon on Sunday 11th December. We welcome Eva into the parish community.
