Sunday Thoughts

"Becoming the Church that honours the vocation of all the

baptised": this is the second area of development of the pastoral plan of our archdiocese, promulgated by Archbishop Malcolm in Advent 2023, almost two years ago now. It can be found on page 24 of the *Pastoral Plan*.

In some ways, our parish already enables the baptised to live their vocation in the responsibilities and practices that many have taken on. There has been a remarkable growth in the engagement of parish members. People are engaged in ministries such as the welcome of people at the door for the Eucharist, and every Tuesday morning with refreshments and snacks. Parishioners also collect clothing and helpful goods to share with those in need of support. The youth have formed a youth group in the spirit of St. Vincent de Paul and accompanied by caring adults. A justice and Peace Group regularly brings to our attention areas in which we can intervene to bring justice and solace to the suffering peoples both near and afar. They help us understand better the need for change in our behaviour in the tackling of the climate crisis. Parish members have done wonders to help us improve our liturgies, constantly ensuring the liturgical readings, singing, and serving; ensuring too the cleanliness and beauty of the church, the order of the sacristy and the safeguarding of all. Others prepare parents for the baptism of their children or marriage. Some do Little Church. A financial council and parish council now advise on and manage the more material affairs of the community. Recently two people have come forward to volunteer as Eucharistic Ministers, helping the priest distribute Communion visiting the sick with Communion in our name.

But much still has to be done to enable us all to live our vocation as disciples of Christ. It is this development that is envisaged by the pastoral Plan #2. We have already begun this development with the pastoral formation offered in the Bible Sharing, in the SVP Conversations, in the recollections given to the Readers and in the Christian Formation offered on the second Tuesday of each month. All of this has been done with Fr. Ferdinand's dedicated leadership. According to the Pastoral Plan, a new programme will be rolled out at deanery and diocesan level in September 2023. This is something we can all look forward to.

In today's gospel, Jesus, talks with vigour about life. He is

already aware that he is going to be murdered in a most violent and painful way, yet he lives in hope and in joy. He is not morose and depressed; his discourse is vibrant and optimist. "I am the living bread", he says, "anyone who eats this bread will live, for ever. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him". "I draw life from the Father and whoever eats me will draw life from me."

There is an enticing vitality in what he says. His words give hope and joy. Jesus's discourse is not about agony and death, as so many news reports today; it is about hope and joy and fullness of life.

When Jesus returned to his Father, he did not abandon us but gave us his Bread of Life. He left this bread, which is indeed his body and blood, so that we may have life and have it in abundance. By the bread and wine which we share with each other, Jesus shares his life with us. He gives us joy and hope. He encourages us. He helps us rise above the vicissitudes of life and remain united with God.

At the Eucharist, Jesus calls us – to come together – to be with other members of the community of his baptised – to hear his Word and to receive his Body and Blood in Communion. By this, Jesus builds up his community, the Church, and we – the Church – we come together to care for each other and to serve each other and to be sent into the world to witness to God's love and to the joy and hope that we experience when we are together with God.

In coming together, we give space to God to be with us. For Jesus said: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst.".
