Remembrance

"Stay awake". This message is given to us as we approach the er liturgical year. On these last Sundays, we are invited to

reflect on the end of time. Doing so will be a proof of wisdom which we are told to seek: "Watch for her early and you will have no trouble."

Our Christian faith gives us hope, an appropriate sentiment during this month of November when we remember, in a particular way, those who have gone before us and more especially today, Remembrance weekend, when we remember those who have died in armed combat. Nor should we forget the victims of war, including the many victims of the wars that are going on in different parts of the world.

Our Christian faith keeps us from despairing, as we watch and pray for better times. Saint Paul reminds us: "We believe that Jesus died and rose again and that it will be the same for those who died in Jesus." We are hoping for this new life. We are waiting for a renewal of all things, when God will be all in all. We pray for this renewal, in union with our Mother Mary and all the Saints canonized or not.

During this weekend when we remember those who have fallen in combat, let us pray for one another, that we may have the courage to prepare for the coming of the Kingdom, for this new world where justice and peace will reign for the glory of God. Amen.

Sunday Thoughts

This week, I will be going on retreat. It's only a short one this year; $4\frac{1}{2}$ days. I would love to do more.

What is a retreat? In Christian terms, it is a time set apart for oneself and for God; a time to reflect and pray. Jesus would often set himself apart from the apostles to be alone with his Father. Sometimes, he took those apostles who were closest with him to retreat to a quiet place: before his baptism, at the Transfiguration, before the raising of Lazarus, for example. They were always intense experiences of meeting God.

One of the greatest encumbrances in life in our society just now is, I think, that we are seldom alone, seldom given a chance to be quiet, to settle down and allow our thoughts to roam. Technology invades personal space incessantly, so that we no longer have personal space. To know ourselves and to know God, we need to do as Jesus did; find a place apart where we can be at peace. This is a retreat.

It can take many forms. It can be 15 minutes in a quiet place in the house or at work. It can be a walk on the seashore or in the countryside. It can be an afternoon with a group of parishioners, set aside for God. Equally, it can be a week or more time off from everything and everyone, closeted in a retreat centre or monastery and just to give ourselves to God in silence.

Few of us have the opportunity to do this. So, this Advent we are going to offer you an **afternoon of recollection** or retreat. What I can tell you just now is that it will not be filled with noise. It is not a session of formation where we will have a talk, group work, discussions and resolutions. It will be, essentially, a time set apart with meditation and listening to the Word of God (lectio divina). It will be a time when participants will be able to feel the loving presence of God in their lives. God will surely share his peace and consolation with us, if we open our hearts to the presence of the Holy Spirit. Hopefully, it will help us make Xmas Christmas!

Let us make an effort to welcome them again, as they come in their quest to create friendship between cultural and religious groups in Liverpool.
