Homíly Notes

The readings today are all about the need to live in a spirit of pardon and forgiveness in

the community of disciples and in our family life. Without this spirit of forgiveness, a community will quickly divide and split. It will fall apart and die. One aspect of forgiveness is the readiness to ask for forgiveness and pardon. When someone who has offended another, even by mishap rather than by intention, is ready to recognise their wrong and ask forgiveness, it is so much easier to forgive.

Today is the second Sunday of the Season of Creation; we could reflect on this gospel, with its theme of forgiveness, in relation to Creation.

Pope Francis writes in Laudato Si #67, "Although it is true that we Christians have at times incorrectly interpreted the Scriptures, nowadays we must forcefully reject the notion that our being created in God's image and given dominion over the earth justifies absolute domination over other creatures".

"Repent" is a call to a change of heart, to turning around and away from our selfish ways. Jesus calls on us to turn back to God. It is indeed time to repent and ask pardon of Mother nature, Mother Earth. It is time to repent and change our exploitative and selfish ways. We can take the means now, not tomorrow, to live in harmony with nature, to live in peace with the ecology of the earth. We can modify our way of life to fit in with the life of the planet.

Nature and the planet Earth have the right to our love and respect, just as much as any human being. Without this earth and nature that has welcomed us for thousands of years, we would not have life.

Today is the time for change; tomorrow will be too late.

Season of Creation

I share share with you some happy news about the Season of

Creation, which I read in the **Independent Catholic News** on Thursday. It's amazing how God can work miracles through the coming together of Christians for the good of society.

"Thousands of priests and religious, families, young people and children, planted more than **60,000 saplings** on Sunday, in parishes across the Diocese of Tagbilaran, in the central Philippine province of Bohol as part of their Season of Creation.

The initiative was one of many activities of the Philippine Catholic Church during the worldwide ecumenical Season of Creation, from September 1 to October 4.

More than 70 church and civil society organisations inaugurated the Philippine celebration of the Season on 1 September. At least 100 volunteers in every parish of Tagbilaran joined the initiative and planted 10 trees each in their surroundings, backyards, and other designated areas.

Bishop Uy said every Christian is called to care about God's creation, pointing out that trees not only beautify the surroundings but also bring many practical benefits to people. "May all of us develop a love for nature and start caring for the environment," he prayed.

According to figures from Global Forest Watch (GFW), which monitors global forests in near real-time, the Philippines had 13.2 million hectares of natural forest, extending over 62% of its land area. In 2019, it lost 48.2 thousand hectares of natural forest, equivalent to 19.1 million metric tons of CO 2 emissions.

From 2001 to 2019, the Philippines lost 1.23 million hectares of tree cover, equivalent to a 6.6% decrease in tree cover since 2000, and 498 million metric tons of CO 2 emissions.

- Joe Savage's Films: Four people volunteered to watch the films and slides of Joe Savage, to select what is of interest and to transfer this to modern media.
- <u>Parish Justice and Peace Group</u>: The Council believes that a J&P is necessary to help the Parish Community live more fully the values of the Gospels.
