Homily Notes

On this Peace Sunday we should pay attention to the opening prayer of the Mass where we are invited to pray to God the Father for the gift of peace.

This emphasises that peace is not something within our grasp, something we can readily attain. Looking at our world, with all the conflicts going on, not only between Russia and Ukraine, between Israel and Hamas, but also in many other parts of the world, we are surely ready to admit that achieving peace is difficult. Accordingly, we have said in this opening prayer to God the Father: "Show us the way to peace in the world."

We have heard how Eli instructed the young Samuel to say, when he hears his name called: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening." That is perhaps the essential lesson. To achieve peace. we must be listening and listening to all sides. To listen to the other side, and to admit that they have valid points, is essential for finding any solution and overcoming conflict.

We all have a tendency to be self-seeking. But Jesus has taught us that we are to love God and to love our neighbour. If we harm our neighbour, we harm ourselves. Paul reminds us that we are temples of the Holy Spirit. We received the Holy Spirit at Baptism and again when we were Confirmed. So, we are to let the Holy Spirit guide us. As Pope Francis has emphasised "listening in the Spirit" is the way of the Church. We are to appreciate what God is doing in people, to see their good points and not only their defects. This listening in the Spirit will help us to overcome conflict, to find unity in diversity.

The Church is to be an instrument of peace in the world. Let us pray that we may be true disciples of Jesus, not seeking our own interests, but ready to serve our brothers and sisters even at cost to ourselves. In this way we shall be instruments of peace.

Sunday Ramblings

Its only 3 weeks since we were singing Christmas Carols "Joy and Peace to the World", yet it seems

that we are as far away from that ideal as were our grandparents in the Christmas of 1940. Pope Francis speaks of a 3rd World War: "one fought piecemeal with crimes, massacres and destruction". Terrible crimes were committed on the 7th of October. Massacres and destruction have followed; even as we sang "Peace to the world".

We Christians abhor all forms of violence. There is no "right" in them. All war is a failure; a failure in dialogue, a failure in forgiveness and reconciliation, values on which we depend in our relationships with each other and with God. We could say that war and violence are failures in our humanity. Speaking about the wars in Ukraine and Gaza, Pope Francis said that modern warfare often does not distinguish between military and civilian objectives. There is no conflict that does not end up in some way "indiscriminately striking" the civilian population. "The events in Ukraine and Gaza are clear proof of this".

In the past three days, the richer nations, dependent for our wealth on the Red Sea and Suez seaways, have taken the war further, shelling Houthi military installations in war-torn Yemen.

Faced with the pain of all this violence and the insecurity and destruction it brings about, we Christians are left helpless and frustrated. This is true also for people of other faiths, who also believe in the primacy of love and mercy and who turn to a merciful and loving God for help. "Allah yusallmna", cries the Muslim. "God come to our aid", cries the Christian. "elohim ya'azor li" cries the Jew. And Jesus, he who could command legions of angels, cries out on the cross, "eloi eloi lama sabachthani".

The parish Justice and Peace group proposes that we turn to God in prayer, pleading for a way out of these wars, pleading for reconciliation, pleading for Justice through which peace will grow. We are arranging a prayer vigil for Friday 2nd February between 6pm and 7pm, here in our church. Please mark it in your diaries. *Terry*
