Homíly Notes

Jn 14:15-21 highlights the Holy Spirit as the Advocate, and revealer of truth.

To understand the role of the Holy

Spirit as an advocate it is helpful to imagine a situation in which there is an accuser and the accused. An advocate takes another's side as a defender in lawsuits. The need for a defender is a common phenomenon that appears in our faith and prayer life. For example, we talk about being a voice for the voiceless to mean being defenders of their dignity and rights. In various places in scripture human beings are portrayed as in need of defense against "enemies", natural forces, evil spiritual forces, etc.

In the context of the death and resurrection of Jesus, the defender argues that the crucified Jesus was innocent, and that God defended him by raising him up. This is demonstrated in the speech of Stephen (Acts 7). The second reading from 1 Peter 3:15-18, prepares the disciples for persecution. In the face of persecution, no matter the source or the form it takes, disciples need the defense of the Spirit. It can be said that in extreme forms of persecution such as martyrdom, the Spirit present in the lives of those who are alive will speak out about the innocence of the victims, the martyrs. The voice of the defender is not easily silenced. Disciples are therefore not to be fearful since they have a defender.

The Spirit of truth dwelling in the lives of the disciples enables them to discover and to live in truth and in unity. In Acts 8:5-8, 14-17, Philip preaches to the Samaritans and baptizes them, and later Peter and John pray for them to receive the Holy spirit. The unit of the Samaritans and non-Samaritans is achieved through Christ.

From The Cathedral Record Pentecost Weekend

By the time of reading this newsletter we will be at the end of a fortnight of celebrations which

began with the Coronation and followed this week by our City's staging of the Eurovision events on behalf of last year's winners, Ukraine. It is to the credit of our City and its people that so many visitors and participants have commented on the genuine welcome that they have received during their time here.

These celebrations may have come to an end but we still have a number of major church celebrations to look forward to as we reach the latter part of the Easter Season. This weekend we celebrate the Anniversary of the Dedication of our Cathedral. Bishop Augustine Harris presided at the opening ceremony and dedication of our Cathedral in 1967 which that year happened to be the weekend of Pentecost. We give thanks for the role that our Cathedral has played within our region over these 56 years and we pray for all who have played a part in the life of our community over these years. Also, this week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension on Thursday.

In a fortnight's time we look forward to the Solemnity of Pentecost. This is not just a major feast within the Church's year; it has considerable local importance for our Cathedral as the feast day on which our building was first opened and for both Liverpool's Cathedrals as the day on which Saint Pope John Paul visited both, and journeyed as a pilgrim along Hope Street.

We have tried to remain faithful to this joint act of pilgrimage between our two cathedrals at Pentecost ever since. This year, the short joint afternoon Pentecost Service will begin at Liverpool Cathedral at 3pm with a short address from the new Bishop of Liverpool, Bishop John Perumbalath. We will then make our way to the steps of our Cathedral to finish with a short service on our Piazza and then if the weather is suitable a party on the steps with an opportunity for picnic and some children's and family activities and games. The theme of the service this year is 'Many Nations, One Church'. It would be great if people could bring various national flags little or larger and even come in national dress just to show our rich diversity of nationality and culture yet our unity in Christ.

International Day of Prayer for Eastern Christians on the Sixth Sunday of Easter 14 May 2023

The International Day of Prayer for Eastern Christians is celebrated annually on the Sixth Sunday of Easter. It offers an opportunity for Eastern and Western Christians to come together in prayer, and to pray for peace in the world, especially in the Middle East and Ukraine.

Christians from all over Europe, the Middle East, the Horn of Africa and India will join together in solidarity on this day to pray that Eastern Christians may be strengthened in their faith so that they can continue steadfastly to give witness to Jesus Christ.

During Easter, Western and Eastern Christians alike hear the Acts of the Apostles which witness to the first preaching of the Gospel. These readings remind us of the origin of the Eastern Churches and the history of the first Eastern Christians, who brought the Gospel to us. Nowadays, many of these Eastern Christians are oppressed and persecuted, and struggle to survive and to pass on our faith to their children, in their own lands where Christianity was born.
