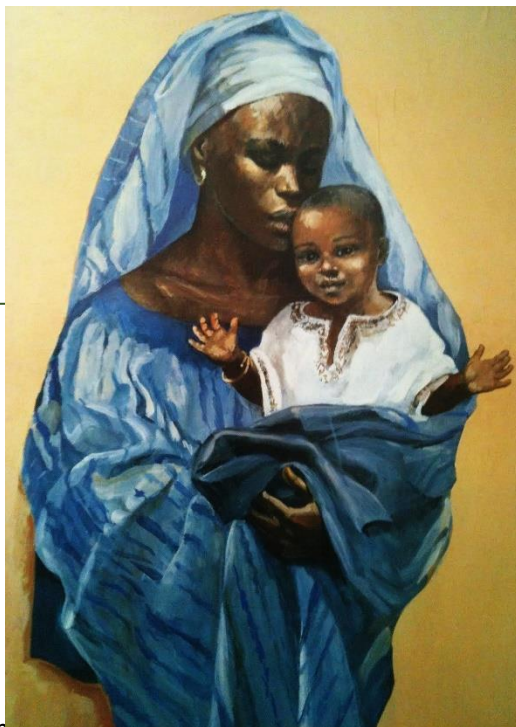

Homily Notes

There is a spirit of Joy in today's Gospel: Mary and Elisabeth experience joy when they meet and there is a great joy in Mary's song of Praise.

Soon after the angel had visited Mary and brought her the news that she would be the mother of Jesus, Mary leaves Nazareth and travels to visit her cousin Elisabeth.

Why does she go? Because she wants to share with someone the news of what has happened. And besides that, she goes to assist her cousin, who is in the sixth' month of pregnancy.

When they meet, there is the joy of two expecting mothers, who rejoice with the coming of two new human beings into the world. There is something more in this meeting. John leaps for joy in his mother's womb. He recognises the arrival of Jesus in Mary's womb. Jesus brings joy into people's lives. Not only 2000 years ago, but also now. Joy fills the hearts and the lives of all who encounter Jesus.

And then we hear how Mary sings, praising God: *My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord.* She praises God for what God has done in her life and in the lives of the lowly. Yes, God is at work also in our lives, God is present and active and raises us up. This is what makes us 'tick' as Christians. What makes us 'tick' is not a set of rules, a set of do's and don'ts, but the recognition and the awareness that God is alive and active in our lives, favouring us and lifting us up. This is what fills us with joy: God's presence and God's love in our lives. This is what makes us go out to others, just like Mary, to serve and share this joy.

From Pope Benedict on today's feast. The Feast of the Assumption is a day of joy. God has won. Love has won. It has won life. Love has shown that it is stronger than death, that God possesses the true strength and that his strength is goodness and love ...

Continuation... Mary is taken up body and soul into the glory of Heaven, and with God and in God she is Queen of Heaven and earth. And is she really so remote from us? The contrary is true. Precisely because she is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us. While she lived on this earth, she could only be close to a few people. Being in God, who is close to us, actually, "within" all of us, Mary shares in this closeness of God. Being in God and with God, she is close to each one of us, knows our hearts, can hear our prayers, can help us with her motherly kindness and has been given to us, as the Lord said, precisely as a "mother" to whom we can turn at every moment. She always listens to us, she is always close to us, and being Mother of the Son, participates in the power of the Son and in his goodness. We can always entrust the whole of our lives to this Mother, who is not far from any one of us.
