Homily Notes

Saturday (vigil) 18.00

I FLED Him, down the nights and down the days;

I fled Him, down the arches of the years;

I fled Him, down the labyrinthine ways

Of my own mind; and in the mist of tears

I hid from Him, and under running laughter.

Up vistaed hopes I sped;

And shot, precipitated,

Adown Titanic glooms of chasmèd fears,

From those strong Feet that followed, followed after.

But with unhurrying chase,

And unperturbèd pace,

Deliberate speed, majestic instancy,

They beat—and a Voice beat

More instant than the Feet—

'All things betray thee, who betrayest Me.'

These are the first lines of "THE HOUND OF HEAVEN," an ode by the Victorian poet, Francis Thompson. He was a Catholic who trained to be a priest and then left the seminary in his final year. He studied medicine but due to his lifestyle and the opium he originally took to ease the pain of his neuralgia but to which he became addicted, he never graduated. It was while he was living destitute on the streets of London that he wrote this poem. It expresses his pain and confusion. He knows that God loves him and seeks him, yet he cannot give in to God's call and turn away from the mistakes of his life.

He flees God, runs away from God, because he cannot give up his self-destroying freedom.

St. Augustine says: "God made us for Himself, and our heart is restless, until it rests in Him".

We forget the great contribution the elderly can still make. They "are the bread that nourishes our lives, the hidden wisdom of a people."


We are invited to "celebrate them" on a "day dedicated to them": the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly Fr. Michael (24 July)
