Homily Notes

This week, Pope Francis invited people of all faiths – and none – to pray for the

end of the pandemic. He said: 'Since prayer is a universal value, I have accepted the proposal (...) for believers of all religions to unite spiritually this 14 May for a day of prayer, fasting, and works of charity, to implore God to help humanity overcome the coronavirus pandemic."

There might be little we can do as individuals to stop this pandemic, except what we have been doing up to now. But we can also pray. And both these approaches are ways that are common to people of all faiths. This virus has reminded us that we are all equal before God as we are equal before this virus. No one is favoured. We are all vulnerable, all weak before its power. Therefore, all believers of all faiths can turn to God and pray. Prayer is something we can do together, and it will increase our understanding of and love for each other.

Prayer is not only imploring God's help when we are in trouble or feeling particularly vulnerable and powerless. Prayer is also the means to allow God to take God's place in our lives. It is the way to the heart of God who is found in our heart. Jesus would spend nights in prayer in the secret of the garden, on a hilltop or on the quiet lake shore. He told us to pray behind the door of our room. For it is in the silence of these intimate moments that God can connect with us and reassure us that He really is here, sharing our suffering and carrying us through the swamp of our pain.

Our Christian vocation, indeed, the vocation of every human being, is to be one with God, to find our place in God's heart. Prayer and good works are the way to do it. Let us pray that in this time of lock-down we use the space given to us to return to God in prayer.

Corona Thoughts

On the Feast of Pentecost five years ago (24 May 2015), Pope Francis unveiled his great encyclical on the environment:

Laudato Si' (Praise Be). It is subtitled 'On Care for our Common Home' and is addressed not just to the Catholic Church, but to the whole of humanity as we face the global climate emergency.

The week of 16-24 May 2020 has been designated **Laudato Si Week** when we are asked to pray about caring for Our Common Home. Laudato Si' Week will end on Sunday, 24 May, with a global day of prayer.

The weeklong celebration is to honour Pope Francis' encyclical on ecology and climate change, and to encourage us to build a better world together.

Previously planned events for Laudato Si' Week are now not possible, but we can grow through the crisis of the current moment by praying, reflecting, and preparing together for a better world to come. The lessons of the encyclical are particularly relevant in the context of the coronavirus pandemic, which has brought many parts of the world to a halt.

Pope Francis, in a recent weekly address, said: "As the tragic coronavirus pandemic has taught us, we can overcome global challenges only by showing solidarity with one another and embracing the most vulnerable in our midst." He went on to say, "As a single and interdependent family, we require a common plan in order to avert the threats to our common home."

Laudato Si' offers a vision for building a more just and sustainable world.
