Homíly Thoughts

The readings today draw our attention to the relationship between

Church and State. God's presence and work go beyond our human boundaries and beyond our knowledge.

In the Gospel, Jesus is asked if it is permissible to pay taxes to Caesar. Sadly, this question is used to trap Jesus. If Jesus answered that it is not permissible, He would have been charged with treason, if He said it is permissible, He would be aligning himself with the Romans against His own people. Jesus answered them: *Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God.*

In this response Jesus does not object to the peoples' civil duty to pay taxes. He also shows that he is not putting Caesar and God on the same level. Caesar does not own anything independently that can be given back to him. Everything belongs to God; "to Yahweh belongs the earth and all it contains" (Psalm 24).

Today we are reminded that we must fulfil our civil duties, but we should also not use them as an excuse for neglecting our duties towards God. Our Christian faith should inform and guide our political preferences and decisions. We are reminded to put God first in our lives, and this will guide our response in our dealings with Government and each other. This is especially true at this time when we wish to support all affected by the COVID 19 pandemic.

Here in our parish we are requested to follow the Government guidelines so that we can all stay safe. We also remember all who are unable to visit their loved ones at home or in Nursing Homes, parents whose work is at risk and children who once again have to self-isolate from school. We commit ourselves to pray together for each other. We entrust all to a God who loves each one and in so doing we are returning to God all that belongs to God.

Pastoral message for

Synod Sunday 2020

I am writing this to you today because this was to have been the weekend of our Synod 2020 gatherings. The situation we are living in at the moment has, as you know, meant that we felt it was right to move this weekend until June next year.

The work of the Synod has not stopped – God is still asking us to reflect on becoming the kind of Church he is calling us to be and in many ways we have been invited to do this with a new urgency at this time. Our Synod journey brings together the "imperatives" of co-responsibility, collaboration and genuine listening between Church leaders and the lay faithful. Synodality is an essential aspect of Church life today. Pope Francis is firm on Synodality as the way forward. I am reminded of something that Pope Benedict said in 2012: "Lay people should not be regarded as 'collaborators' of the clergy, but, rather, as people who are really 'coresponsible' for the Church's being and acting ... It is therefore important that a mature and committed laity be consolidated, which can make its own specific contribution to the ecclesial mission with respect for the ministries and tasks that each one has in the life of the Church."

This is very much your role in the next part of our Synod journey. Over 3,500 proposals were submitted – thank you. The Synod Working Party (and others) have worked with all these proposals and have faithfully kept all the proposals and ideas that you have highlighted. They have produced a summary which we are making available to you this weekend. (You can find them at synod2020.co.uk/proposals).
