Homily Notes

Saturday (vigil) 18.00

In today's Gospel Jesus continues his long sermon on the mount. He is teaching us

a new way of living. Today, Jesus speaks about 'revenge' and about 'mutual love'.

On taking revenge, the law of Moses in the book of Exodus teaches: 'Eye for eye and tooth for tooth'. This law was introduced to put limits to revenge and make it proportional to the offence. However, Jesus says: But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. For Jesus, vengeance should be excluded altogether. The vicious circle of retaliation needs to be broken, and that can only by opposing vengeance altogether.

Jesus does not stop us from defending ourselves in situations of unjust aggression and even less of opposing evil in the world. But Jesus wants to exclude vengeance. How do we educate our children and ourselves? What do we teach? When they hit you, hit back! Or, when they hit you, walk away!

After that, Jesus continues saying: I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. Love your enemies. How is this possible humanly speaking for us, weak as we are? On ourselves, it is not possible. We need to draw close to Jesus, for him to infect us 'positively'. When we reflect on his words and his life, when we draw close to him in prayer and the Eucharist, he can infect us 'positively', in order to become whole and healthy, more like him.

God alone is good, God causes his sun to rise on bad people as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest people alike.

Jesus calls us to resemble our heavenly Father more and more, to be truly his children, and for that to ask for his help.

Thoughts on Lent

Lent begins on Wednesday, Ash Wednesday. It begins with

ashes, an ancient sign of repentance, a

regret for a wrong done, a desire to turn around one's life.

"What are you giving up for Lent?", we are sometimes asked by our parents or friends. But the question would be better put as "What are you doing for Lent". Yes, there is an element of fasting in Lent – giving up chocolates, alcohol, TV, or whatever else seems to us to be in some way unhealthy. But this is mostly searching for what is profitable for me. Once again, I am the centre of my action. I will do something from which I will profit.

But what if I want to do something for the love of another, the others? This would be more Christ-like. Then I would have to do, rather than not do. I could, for instance, watch my tongue, to speak only good of the other, to say what is upbuilding, encouraging. And if in a situation I could not think of something positive and good to say, I would have to say nowt. I could visit a home-bound relative or person, check on their needs, cheer them up with my presence. This would be good for many people, especially for those in our care homes... I could give some time to prayer or to reading the Gospel, getting to know the source of my life, Jesus. It would help me in my quest for holiness, in my search for God.

Lent is a time for looking forward, not backward. Like Advent, Lent looks forward; to Easter and the self-giving of Jesus for the good of all, which resulted in his resurrection. We want to rise up, escape the conundrum of our selfishness and sin. We want to do good for others, to improve this world which threatens us with stabbing on our streets, drugs in our alleys, stress and strife at work, war across our borders.

Lent is a time to do just that. This week, Pax Christi offers us the opportunity to take action against war, CAFOD invites us to walk 200 sponsored km in Lent to fight world poverty, the parish invites us to help on a Tuesday morning to welcome people in difficulty with a cup of tea. All these are opportunities to join with Jesus and build his Kingdom of Peace.
