where people meet Jesus, and through conversation with him and things he does, come to recognize him as the Saviour. They have a particular significance for those approaching Baptism, illustrating the journey to God as the passage from darkness to

light, from death to life. Today's theme is Jesus as the light of the world, the one who enters the darkness of the man born blind, who dazzles him and the world with his light, and illuminates all who live in darkness. As St. John says, that darkness cannot overcome him. The man born blind is brought to light. He washes in the pool, the water, a symbol of Baptism. First of all, he is able to see physically, but much more significantly he is brought to the light of faith. The Pharisees who have always had physical sight, suffer the worst possible blindness. Waiting for the one God has promised they fail to recognise him when he comes. They are so full of their own ideas of how God should work. They have failed to reflect on their Scriptures in a spirit of real humility. They have reduced God to their own level. They are the ones who are really blind.

The conversation, as John presents it in the Gospel, also reflects a stage in the development in the Church at the time that John is writing, when all converts from Judaism to Christianity had been expelled from the Synagogue, and their families forbidden to speak to their Christian relatives. John is begging these new Christians not to renege on their faith, saying that those who are in darkness, those truly blind, are the people who reject Jesus as Lord, not recognising the real fulfilment of the ancient promises. Jesus alone is the light of the world. So, it comes back to us, John is saying. There is an urgency in these readings. Now is the time, No more hesitation. To look elsewhere is to be in darkness. Mother's Day

Like so many of our modern traditions, the celebration of Mothers' Day goes back to ancient Rome and Greece. At this

time of the year, they held festivals in honour of their mother goddesses Rhea and Cybele. These feasts were later "enculturated" by the Christians in northern Europe. On the fourth Sunday of Lent, they would travel to their home churches, where they grew up, to visit them and remember their baptism. These home churches were referred to as "Mother Churches". They would also visit their mothers and families on the occasion, so it became a popular family feast.

You will have noticed that our Mothers' Day is always celebrated on the 4th Sunday of Lent. In the USA it is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of May. Their Mothering Sunday developed in another way. After their civil war, many children were abandoned, and many women could not cope with the care of their children. A certain Ana Jarvis, began a campaign to help women re-learn the skills of motherhood and the care of their children. This quickly became a movement, with groups of women all over the country. They established an annual holiday when motherhood was celebrated and families gathered for the feast.

Today, she would be shocked at the commercialisation of the holiday! Maybe we should remind ourselves of our origins and make this day not only a thanksgiving for our mothers, but also for our baptism. Terry
