In the gospel today, we find the sudden emergence of a faith-filled and persistent voice of an excluded person. The Canaanite in the story is a gentile, a woman, a person troubled by the spiritual illness

of her daughter, and an inhabitant of the gentile territory of Tyre and Sidon. It is written; suddenly out came a Canaanite woman from the district and started shouting, Lord, son of David, take pity on me. The disciples were upset by her shouting (Mt 15:21-28). This may remind us of similar stories in the Gospel such as that of Bartimaeus, a blind beggar who sat by the roadside and who persistently and loudly shouted: Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me. The disciples scolded him and told him to keep quiet (Mk10:46). Today, the response of the disciples is not to scold, to silence, or to rebuke. Their response is to beg Jesus with the words: give her what she wants because she is shouting after us. Though it is a response that does not acknowledge her faith, her pain or show compassion for her tormented daughter, it is nevertheless a favorable

St. Mathew is addressing a Jewish Christian community that is on a challenging spiritual journey of welcoming Gentiles. The idea that the Gentiles and Jews would belong to one God's family in faith was not a new idea to the Jewish Christians. Isaiah for example had prophesied that the gentiles who profess faith in God will all be gathered on God's holy Mountain (Isaiah 56:1,6-7). We find an example of the challenge and development of this faith journey in the person of Peter. It is his vision at Jaffa that enabled him to overcome the Jew/Gentile barrier. After the vision he listened to the voice of Cornelius, a God-fearing gentile centurion (Acts 10:1-43).

Besides our spiritual journeys across different barriers in which we all share, the Gospel draws our attention to the persistency, faith and hope of parents who care for their daughters and sons in need of healing.

SEASON of CREATION: 1 September – 4 October 2023

Every year, the Season of Creation (**SOC**) is a major ecumenical moment to pray, reflect and act for the protection of our Common Home. The **SOC** begins on September 1, a

day of prayer for the safeguarding of

creation, and ends on October 4, the feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, patron saint of ecology.

The theme of this year's **SOC** is "Let justice and peace flow". It is inspired by the words of the prophet Amos: "But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!" (5:24). The symbol used is "a mighty river".

The theme is a prophetic voice, calling us to discern and make the choice to collaborate in God's redemptive mission. The words of the prophet Amos reveal to us God's desire in our time in relation to his creation. It is a call to contemplate God's creation, to recognise and appreciate our intertwined relationship with all that he has created.

In his address to us all, *Pope Francis* reminds us of three aspects necessary in our efforts to safeguard our mother earth.

- 1. Personal ecological conversion: this is the transformation of our hearts in relationship with God, built on the conviction that all that exists is God's artwork that we are to value and relate to with reverence.
- 2. Transformation of our lifestyle: this concerns the daily choices we make and their impact on others and on creation. It is a call from self-centeredness to be all to all for life. It is to see with new eyes of love and compassion.
- 3. Transformation of public and societal policies that deny creation its right to exist.

As we participate in this particular and important period with serious intentional acts, let us look at our lifestyle, at times marked by waste and unnecessary consumption of material things and other toxic unfriendly items in daily life. May we be mindful of our habits and choices to make a better place for us and for future generations.
