 \mathcal{W} hat it was like for these four

men who Jesus called to follow him? We know that they were fishermen by trade and little else. The life them had before them was non-descript; a routine that would follow the pattern of the lives of all. They were not schooled so would know little about the world beyond the shores of the lake. They would have to work every day to supply their families with food and some cash. They would survive only if they accepted the monotony and the routines of life, as everyone else.


Jesus came along, offering them, maybe, something else. Did they already know him? Possibly, as Jesus was already preaching and teaching in that area of northern Israel. Maybe they had heard and were already enamoured by the way he spoke and what he had to say. So, when he surprised them at work, they were ready to drop everything and follow him. To what? To anything that was more exciting, more life-giving than the humdrum of life on the shores of Lake Galilee.

Maybe, at first, that was all that mattered; get away from here, follow this man whose words intrigue them, and see what it brings. "We can always come home tomorrow if it doesn't work out". They soon found out that following this mysterious man brought them nothing but hardship: long treks over insecure, mountain tracks, facing dangers from brigands and wild animals, days without food and nights without rest, sleeping wherever they dropped from exhaustion; arguments with religious people who saw their new leader as a blaspheming renegade who threatened all their securities and privileges. And it would all end in the disaster of betrayal and crucifixion.

Yet they stayed with him. In those 2 or 3 years that they toughed it out, they learnt to live in community with likeminded people. They experienced companionship that they might never have known if they had stayed in Galilee. They learnt about true love that comes from God alone. They let go of the false values that could never fill the emptiness of a loveless, greedy, power-craving heart, and allowed the love of God, lived in their discipleship to overwhelm them and fill them to the brim. They knew only happiness and joy and hope in the face of the greatest hardships. TPM

Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity

Catholic and Anglican bishops will hold an ecumenical summit in Rome and Canterbury for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. More than 50 bishops are set to participate over 22-29 January, arriving in pairs representing each denomination in 27 countries.

On 25 January, Pope Francis and the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby will commission the bishops at the tomb of St Paul, in the Basilica of St Paul Outside the Walls. They will be sent out "in pairs, to be witnesses to Christian Unity," according to a statement from the Anglican Communion.

The service will recall Christ's commission of the Apostles, when he gathered the Twelve "to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over unclean spirits" (Mk 6:7), and the other disciples he "sent on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go" (Lk 10:1)

"This will be a significant moment, symbolic for Anglican-/Catholic bonds and advancing ecumenical dialogue", the Anglican Communion statement said.

The summit, "Growing Together", has been organised by the International Anglican-Roman Catholic Commission for Unity and Mission, to "discuss ways of growing together in joint witness and mission in the world" (The Tablet)
