Jesus' Exultant Entry into Jerusalem Scriptural reflections for Palm Sunday

Every year on the Sunday before Easter, the Church celebrates Palm

Sunday, which marks the beginning of the Holy Week. During this week, we prepare ourselves for Easter by piously reflecting on the events of Jesus' passion and death. It is a day that recalls the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. It is a reminder for Christians to welcome Jesus into their hearts and to be willing to follow him. This entry is highly symbolic as it demonstrates that Christ is the Davidic king that fulfilled this ancient prophecy: "He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness" - Isaiah 9:7. The first and second readings of this Sunday are centred on the suffering and humility of Christ, the Son of God. The first reading is the song of the suffering servant of God. Paul reminds us of the humility and obedience of Christ, the servant of God. Jesus humbly accepted all His sufferings to save us by offering and losing His life to secure victory for us. The most important lesson from all this is that the virtues of patience, humility, and obedience are central in life.

The palms represent Christ's royalty and peaceful reign, "He shall be the prince, and the king of peace" - Is 11: 1-9; 9:6, the donkey symbolizes Christ's humility and the crowd symbolizes both praise and rejection. The same crowd singing "Hosanna, Hosanna" also asked Christ's crucifixion. The procession is to honour Christ as He enters the royal city, showing our union with Christ as He begins the journey of our salvation. It's sad to see that some of those who praised Christ with the shout of hosanna, were the same people who asked: "crucify him" on Good Friday. This shows that Christ is our friend when we are in trouble. ...We pray for the Grace to remain faithful to the end.

Holy Week

Is there, I wonder, a tendency for some, even in the Catholic Church, to forget God? We are so engaged in the social aspect of the Gospel, that we forget that God lives in Society and in each of us.

There is also the opposing tendency to leave aside much of what involves society and to concentrate on the worship of God. If you concentrate on the sacristy, then God will look after the problems of society! My guess is that Jesus had a foot in both camps. Loving God can not exclude loving my neighbour. Loving my neighbour in the Christian context cannot exclude God.

"Holy week" is an invitation to give more emphasis and time to God. There are 5 great days in Holy Week in which we are invited to join the Community of Disciples in meditation of the Word and prayer. Firstly, there is this weekend, Palm Sunday. We meditate on Christ's entry into Jerusalem; in something approaching triumph. The Kingdom, they thought, had arrived. But Christ's Kingdom is not what we think and at the end of the week we meditate on the Last Supper he took with his disciples; Holy Thursday, when he shared the Bread and Wine that were to become his Body and Blood, so cruelly shed for us on the cross. And he left us a sign of what we were to do; wash each other's feet.

Good Friday is when it all came to a sudden and abrupt end. The crucified body and the flowing blood were real. Mary received her dead Son in her arms and meditated on what it is to give one's life in death so that others might live.

And live He did when he rose again into a new life. We share in this new life, through the sacrament of the Eucharist and the sacrament of our good works, which are both signs of God with us still.

Do not, I pray, forget the need for prayer during this Holy Week; a special time of retreat at Easter. TPM
