

Homily Notes

We can admire Jesus as a true communicator. He tells his disciples that he has made the Father's name known, in other words he has revealed what God the Father is really like. Jesus has not invented this. He says that he has given them the teaching that the Father gave to him. Yet he has been creative in communicating this knowledge of God, through parables and stories. Above all he has shown who God is through his deeds: in feeding the multitudes he has shown the generosity of God; in healing the sick, he has shown mercy and compassion. So he can say: "to have seen me is to have seen the Father".

This was not easy to understand, especially when the disciples saw their Master suffering on the Cross. So Jesus promises them the Holy Spirit who will teach them everything and help them to understand. So, we see that the disciples returned to Jerusalem and gathered in the Upper Room in order to pray for the coming of the Spirit, and they did so together with Mary, the mother of Jesus.

We should be doing this too. We need to pray for the Holy Spirit, so that we can understand the message of Jesus. We can ask Mary, our mother, to help us. We can ask also to be able to communicate the message of Jesus to others, not only by our words, but especially through the example of our lives. Just as Jesus showed kindness, going around doing good, so we should be kind. Just as Jesus was merciful and forgiving, so we too should be ready to forgive. Just as Jesus was ready to serve and give his life for others, so we too should be ready to serve others. We should be ready to answer people when they ask us the reason for our behaviour. We are not to be afraid to say that being Christians, followers of Jesus Christ, makes a difference to the way we live.

Not easy. But Jesus is praying for us.

The Kitchen

This week, we received the visit from the builders who will install the new kitchen in the church. The work involves moving the present food bank store to the next room along. This means that this week we must empty that room of all its contents.

What is not claimed will be thrown out, so, please, if you have anything in there that you want to keep, take it out this week. The builders will move in very soon.

The kitchen will contain cupboards and shelves for storage, a fridge, electric cooker top, oven, dish washer and sink; the equipment we need to improve our service to the visitors we receive on Tuesday mornings, and make it easier to cater for social events and refreshments after Mass. It will make it safer for the volunteers too.

This is an important step in rendering our church building more suitable to the mission that is asked of it and us in this new age, where we are all reminded of our missionary vocation and the need to engage in Christian witness in our area of the city.

The numbers of people crossing our doorstep on a Tuesday morning has increased three or fourfold since the end of the pandemic. More people from the neighbourhood need a helping hand to get by. They can no longer make ends meet. Refugees, too, have heard of the way we treat them with dignity and respect. They have heard that we do more than simply dish out food, that we also have clothes, cases, kitchenware, and other useful things to share with them. They come from those areas of the city where they are spat upon, insulted and sometimes suffer violence, to come to a place where they feel safe and accepted.

Who knows how each one of us would manage, if the situation in this country were to turn sour, as it has done in theirs? And in this day and age, it could so easily happen. Let us treat them, as we would have them treat us were our situations reversed.

World Communications Sunday



Pope Francis has released his message for
World Communications Day.

He stresses the need to listen before
speaking truth with a pure heart to “see
beyond appearances and overcome the
vague din which, also in the field of
information, does not help us discern in the
complicated world in which we live.”

“The call to speak with the heart,” he says,
“radically challenges the times in which we
are living, which are so inclined towards
indifference and indignation, at times even
on the basis of disinformation which
falsifies and exploits the truth.”

The Pope hails the example of St Francis de
Sales and his commitment to patient,
heartfelt dialogue with everyone – even
those who opposed him. A gifted
theologian, his phrase “*Heart speaks to
heart*” inspired many, none more so than St.
John Henry Newman who, on being made a
Cardinal in 1879, chose as his motto, *Cor ad
cor loquitur* or **Heart speaks to heart.**

We will remember that ‘*Heart speaks unto
heart*’ was also the motto for Pope Benedict
XVI’s historic visit to the UK in 2010. It is
a model for us all as we engage in
conversations with non-believers around us.
