Homíly Thoughts

In today's Gospel the Pharisees are trying to trick Jesus again, asking him: Master, which is the greatest commandment?

Jesus answers: You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself.

Love of God and love of neighbour: the two commandments go together; they are like two sides of one coin. There is no love of God without love of our brother and sister, because God is in all. God lives in all.

But what is love? Is Love about feelings? Yes, but not only. Is love about romance and mutual attraction? Yes, but not always and not only.

There is more. Love is about parents who care for their handicapped child, a wife who looks after her husband who is sick, or the other way around, a teacher who wakes up early to be well prepared for the next day of classes, neighbours who care for each other during this pandemic. There are so many examples. In true love, there is always an element of gift. In true love we make ourselves a gift to the other.

But how? To truly love can be difficult. St John writes: *Let us love then because God loves us first*. Love is a gift from God. God is the source. Let us open our hearts for God's love. And in that way, we can share that love with others.

On this Mission Sunday, we want to remember that this is the mission of each one of us: to share God's love with others: far and near, abroad and at home and in our street and city.

Here am I, send me (Is 6:8) Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This invitation from God's merciful heart challenges both the Church and humanity in the current world crisis. In this context, the call to mission, the invitation to step out of ourselves for love of God and neighbour presents itself as an opportunity for sharing, service and intercessory prayer. The mission that God entrusts to each one of us leads us from fear and introspection to a renewed realization that we find ourselves precisely when we give ourselves to others.

Out of his love for us, God the Father sent his Son Jesus. Jesus is the Father's Missionary: his life and ministry reveal his total obedience to the Father's will.

Mission is a free and conscious response to God's call. Yet we discern this call only when we have a personal relationship of love with Jesus present in his Church. Let us ask ourselves: are we prepared to listen to the call to mission, whether in our life as married couples or as consecrated persons or those called to the ordained ministry, and in all the everyday events of life...?

Understanding what God is saying to us at this time of pandemic also represents a challenge for the Church's mission. Illness, suffering, fear, and isolation challenge us. The poverty of those who die alone, the abandoned, those who have lost their jobs and income, the homeless and those who lack food challenge us. Being forced to observe social distancing and to stay at home invites us to rediscover that we need social relationships as well as our communal relationship with God. Far from increasing mistrust and indifference, this situation should make us even more attentive to our way of relating to others.
