Christian Formation

If a doctor, once she is qualified and registered, never opens a medical journal, or follows a renewal course, she will soon be out of touch with medical progress and lose the confidence of her patients and

fellow doctors. If an electrician does not keep up to date with new electrical technology, he will lose his customers and his business will fail. It is surely the same for any profession and any knowledge that we acquire for life. If we do not keep up our formation, we will atrophy and fall by the wayside.

How come, then, do we tend to think that once we are confirmed, or once we have left school, there is no need to do anything else to maintain our faith and our love of God? When we are fourteen, is our knowledge of the faith complete? Can we say "I now know it all and have no further need of formation in my faith?

Sometimes we are called "People of the Book – the Bible". I would rather say, "We are people of Jesus; people who are in a relationship with Jesus and so with God". A relationship needs to be nourished, or it will grow stale and may even die.

So it is that as Christians, we need to constantly renew and keep up to date with the "knowledge" of the faith. If not, our knowledge of God will soon atrophy and die.

We feed our faith, we renew our faith through prayer. But it needs more than that; it also needs education and formation. The church has failed in recent years by not offering the faithful disciples further formation; by leaving them at a stage of development of their faith at the level of a 14 year old. How can we become "adult" in our relationship with God, in our faith, if we do not grow?

Bible reading, spiritual reading, attending courses such as the Alpha course, RCIA, and all the others that you can find on You Tube; all these are essential if we want to grow in faith and in love of God.
