Prayer for Holy Week

This weekend we will begin Holy Week. It is, for us Christians, the most important week of the year.

During this week, we will celebrate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, as a humble king

seated on a donkey. We will also remember his Last Supper with his friends, during which he shared the bread and wine of the Passover with the apostles and some friends and told them that the bread and the wine were his body and blood, and he invited them to "do this in memory of me".

We will remember how Jesus was rejected by the leaders, how he suffered, and how, out of love, he died nailed on a cross. And on Easter Sunday we will celebrate how Jesus rose from the dead, thus overcoming the power of death, of hatred, of war and of all that is evil.

I offer you this prayer, which we prayed this week at St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Primary School, as a prayer you could say each day during this Holy Week.

> Lord, as we progress through Holy Week, we ask you to help us travel with you to *Ierusalem*.

Help us to be united with you, and with all those who suffer now in their pain, abandonment and loneliness. Help us to die with you to sin and to everything that goes against respect and love.

Today is Palm Sunday. We call it Palm Sunday, because when Jesus entered Jerusalem, the crowds cheered him, waving their branches. Today is also Passion Sunday. We call it Passion Sunday, because Jesus entered

Jerusalem where he will suffer and die.

Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey. He did not travel the whole way from Galilee to Jerusalem on a donkey. He mounted it few miles before entering the city. This was a symbolic action. Jesus chose to enter on the back of a donkey to fulfil what had been spoken by the prophet Zachariah: "look your King is coming, humble and riding on a donkey".

Jesus wanted to show that his kingship is different from that of other kings. Over the centuries, so many kings and armies entered through the gates of Jerusalem: the Babylonians, the Greeks, the Romans, the Turks, the Germans and the British...all on their horses, in their chariots or armoured vehicles. Jesus however, entered on the back of a donkey.

He entered to install his Kingdom, but not by force, killing, violence or bombardments. He installed his Kingdom by being faithful to the end, by giving himself, out of love for his people. In his Kingdom he unites people of different races and languages. In his kingdom, the only law is love, love of God and love of neighbour.

Today we celebrate the joyful entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. Today Jesus wishes to enter Jerusalem again: our Jerusalem, which is our world, our church and parish community, our lives. He wishes to enter to install his Kingdom in our hearts.

Where do we stand? Do we welcome Him or do we reject Him? Do we welcome his Kingdom or reject it? Let us praise and acclaim Jesus as our King and Ferdinand welcome Him.
