Jesus saw Zacchaeus in the tree. He stopped and spoke to him with words that melted his heart. They melted away all his greed and his

pride. They melted away all his resistance to God's love, and the incredible thing happened. Jesus says,

"Zacchaeus, I want to come to your house and eat with you tonight". No condemnation. No admonition. No conditions... No 'If you change', or 'if you convert'. Just a straightforward, "I want to come to your house, now, just as you are. Only get down from that tree and stop making a further fool of yourself".

Jesus knew the power of love. He knew too that this man wanted to find peace in his life; wanted to be on good terms with God, with his conscience and with his people. Jesus knew that Zacchaeus was ripe for a change in his life, and he gave him the means to achieve it.

We know that Zacchaeus responded in the most generous and radical way and his life changed. Zacchaeus touched the child within himself, as he had not done for many years. He found his self-respect and new *joie de vivre* – a new, intense joy in being the friend of God that would also allow himself to be the friend of all his neighbours. His conversion was profound, it was radical, it was complete.

This is what Jesus does for each of us. There is no prejudice in Jesus. He does not look at us and say "I can see the bad in you. I know what you have done, in the past, and your mistakes, and I will expose them to all..." That's not the way of Jesus. He only sees the good within us. He sees the love that is seeking to reach out to others, despite our fears and our doubts, despite the mistakes we have made, the wounds we have suffered or have even imposed on others. He sees our desire for peace within. He sees our loneliness and our pain. And he calls us down from our precarious position and says, "I want to dwell in you tonight". *Terry*

Ramblings

We lost a good and faithful member of our parish community this week. Mary Thompson died peacefully, surrounded by her

devoted family and friends on Friday evening. Everyone loved Mary because she loved them. She had no children of her own, but everyone was her child. She was always there to help and to care for others. Now, she will be with God and will pray for us all.

We will need her prayers in the months and years to come. On the reverse of this page, 3 notices seem to sum up the urgency of our needs. One is under the title of "Warm and Cosy" and informs us of the move by many parishes to open their centres and halls to people who are under pressure from the economic crisis; who can't afford to eat and heat together. Some 40 centres across the archdiocese will be open to receive them with warmth and with lunch – as we do every Tuesday morning from 10am to noon.

The second notice concerns the You Tube film, "The letter – a message for our Earth". This film is a "must see" for us all, especially if we are guided by our faith. The letter is "Laudato Si", the letter of Pope Francis, written 7 years ago. The film is about why we should heed the cry of Pope Francis and begin a real conversion in our lives and in our relationship with Planet Earth. It brings us face to face with the reality of Climate Change and the impact it is having on real peoples' lives. If you can't access You Tube, please go and watch it with the members of St. Anne's parish, Edge Hill.

The 3rd notice I see as important is that of the TAIZE PRAYER. For me, it reminds us of the importance of prayer. Prayer is the means of staying in touch with Christ. When we are at one with Christ, we do as Mary Thompson; we see the suffering of others and we are led to do what we can in love for them. The love of Christ reaches out to them, through our prayer which leads us to action. Taizé prayer, with fellow Christians from other churches and with people of other faiths, as with all forms of prayer, will stimulate our faith and give us hope to know that we can heal the planet if we just work together.
