Pastoral Letter

This week, in Glasgow,

delegates and government leaders of almost every country in the world will meet under the title "COP 26". Of the content of this meeting Pope Francis says:

This crisis presents us "with the need to take decisions, radical decisions that are not always easy. At the same time, moments of difficulty like these also present opportunities, opportunities that we must not waste".

Political decision-makers meeting at Cop26 "are urgently summoned to provide effective responses to the present ecological crisis and in this way to offer concrete hope to future generations. And it is worth repeating that each of us – whoever and wherever we may be – can play our own part in changing our collective response to the unprecedented threat of climate change and the degradation of our common home."

Maybe inspired by the Pope, our own Bishop Malcolm, has written to us. His letter will be read out at all Masses this weekend. He too invites us to take seriously the matter of Climate Change: "However, we all have a personal responsibility in these matters not just governments and the truth is that each and every one of us has some responsibility for the desecration of our beautiful earth and each and every one of us can do something about it. There are a whole range of actions which you might consider, for example:

- Using public transport, walking or cycling rather than car use
- Cutting down on the amount of meat you eat
- Avoiding single use plastic as much as you can
- Buying locally produced food if possible
- Recycling waste.

I would urge parishes and schools to work towards the Cafod Live Simply Award, which asks us to Live Simply, Sustainably and in Solidarity with the Poor and includes a number of these kinds of actions at both the individual and the parish or school level.

Let each of us and all of us as a community reflect and pray on this serious question.
