## Gospel Thoughts

In the darkness of winter, we can fall into despair, for there is much to despair about: the resurgence of COVID and the recurring threat to our health and our superficial freedoms; the awful pictures and stories

of the migrants massing on the borders of Poland or drowning in the Channel, misused as political pawns by governments frightened of their right wing voters. We are horrified as we watch elements of our society crumble into drugs and the ensuing violence and terror on some of our streets.

So, we pray for anyone going through dark days at the present time: for people insecure in their jobs, their health or their home life; for displaced people and refugees, who wait at barbed-wired-borders, hoping to get to a better life; for those barely alive in the famine of East Africa and in countries torn apart by civil strife and terrorism.

St. Paul bids us to look at life and especially at people through eyes tinted with hope, even in dark times. His praise and joyful message to the people of Philippi reminds us of the way Jesus always looked at people; able to see beyond the exterior, right into the goodness of their true selves. To see people through hopeful eyes makes us aware of the good in their lives. To look with the eyes of hope and love, lets us recognise the good they have done rather than what they have failed to do. Paul hopes that God who began this good work among them would bring it to completion.

Let's look at ourselves too with hopeful eyes, with the eyes of God and the eyes of St. Paul. God's good work has only begun in us. God will bring the good work to completion. All we need do is to co-operate with the working of grace. ## Advent Sharing

The newsletter this week is filled with invitations to events. Parish life is getting busy as we journey towards Christmas. We are invited to a recollection for the Readers, to a meeting of the SVP JPIC

group, to Mass on December 8<sup>th</sup>, to Gospel Sharing on Wednesday, Bingo on the 17<sup>th</sup> and a Coral Christmas Concert on the 16<sup>th</sup>. The Financial Council meets on the 7<sup>th</sup> and there is a celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on the 20<sup>th</sup>. We can't be everywhere.

Faced with these demands of parish community life and home life too, we may wonder if we will ever sit in peace between now and Christmas! It is good to hear the words of Pope Francis at the beginning of Advent: "*Even during our busiest days, we must not neglect prayer.*" The Pope stressed that *prayer always keeps the lamp of our heart lit, bringing us back to God, reawakening the soul from slumber and focusing it "on what matters, on the purpose of existence"*. We must never neglect prayer, he underscored, and to avoid that we can consider prayer of the heart, repeating brief invocations. The Pope suggested that during Advent we make a habit of saying "*Come, Lord Jesus"* through the day.

"Come Lord Jesus" might be the prayer we will utter at the beginning of Saturday evening's Mass, when we take a moment of silence to pray quietly for Ava White and Arthur Labinjo-Hughes and all other child victims of violence, physical and sexual abuse. We pray too for the perpetrators of these crimes.

Advent being a time of repentance, we will also receive through the "*Asperges*" the waters of baptism, reminding us to allow God to turn our hearts back to God's way and allow God's Spirit to enter into our hearts with the Spirit of Peace and of fortitude.

May the Son of God calm all our fears in his Love and fill us with peace and Joy as we begin the second week of our journey through Advent.
