Homily Notes

The route to true Leadership

The three readings converge on the theme of leaders and leadership.

The prophecy of Malachy comes in a context in which Haggai and Zacharia had given good leadership after the exile. The Temple had been built and the community flourished. But this period was followed by a phase in which the thirst for God diminished and community life had deteriorated in general. The prophet Malachi awakened the people to their true calling by pointing out what was going wrong. He had a message for the spiritual leaders (priests), who had lost their vigour and favour and were failing to bring people to God through worship and sound teaching. The people were both estranged from God and from one another (Mal.1:14-2:2.8-10)

In the Gospel reading (Mt 23:1-12), the pharisees and the scribes, though zealous, had failed to provide good faith leadership. They had distorted the law and turned it into a burden, they dressed in a manner meant to win admiration, and they loved titles which gave rise to a hierarchical structure. This love for honour and titles created obstacles to people's experience of brotherhood and sisterhood in the family of God.

In the second reading St Paul comes across as a leader who is devoted, enthusiastic, hardworking, full of love for his people, and always ready to share the word of God. He gives a sound teaching that is based on his personal relationship with Christ and not on human wisdom (1 Thes 2:7-9.13). Paul is presented here as an example of a good leader.

The words of Malachi, the admonition of Jesus, and the example of Paul are meant to awaken us to our true calling, and to remind us that the route to true leadership is through the service of God in all things. As we search for our true selves in God, and for the true leadership; ours can be the psalm 16:11: "You show me the path of life".... Fr Charles

The Church of the Future: Extracts from the Homily of Pope Francis at the closing Mass of the first session of the Synod on 29.10. 2023.

It is important to look at the "principle and foundation" from which everything begins ever anew: by loving. Loving God with our whole life and loving our neighbour as ourselves. Not our strategies, our human calculations, the ways of the world, but love of God and neighbour: that is the heart of everything.

To love is to adore. Adoration is the first response we can offer to God's gratuitous and astonishing love. The amazement of adoration, the wonder of worship, is something essential in the life of the Church, especially in our own day in which we have abandoned the practice of adoration.

We are always at risk of thinking that we can "control God", that we can confine his love to our own agenda. Instead, the way he acts is always unpredictable, it transcends our thinking, and God's way of acting consequently demands amazement and adoration. Amazement is very important!

To love is to serve...We may have plenty of good ideas on how to reform the Church but let us remember: to adore God and to love our brothers and sisters with his love, *that* is the great and perennial reform.

This, brothers and sisters, is the Church we are called to "dream": a Church that is the servant of all, the servant of the least of our brothers and sisters. A Church that never demands an attestation of "good behaviour," but welcomes, serves, loves and forgives. A Church with open doors that is a haven of mercy.

Brothers and sisters, the General Assembly of the Synod has now concluded. In this "conversation of the Spirit," we have experienced the loving presence of the Lord and discovered the beauty of fraternity... The Lord will guide us and help us to be a more synodal and missionary Church, a Church that adores God and serves the women and men of our time, going forth to bring to everyone the consoling joy of the Gospel.

Update from the Deanery Synodal Council

The Deanery Synodal Council have been meeting now for over 18 months and we are now reaching a stage of forging the concept of 'Family of Parishes' and the last two meetings of the full Deanery Synodal Council, comprising clergy and laity, have been to consolidate this. The proposal we are working with for Liverpool Central Deanery is Liverpool North, Liverpool South and Liverpool Central which includes the Metropolitan Cathedral. The work is ongoing, but we have a basic plan which we hope to present to the Archdiocesan Synodal Council, (ASC).

The ASC will take place on Saturday 25th November. Eight representatives (one priest and seven parishioners) will represent each Deanery in the Archdiocese. The task of the ASC is to monitor the progress of the Pastoral Plan issued after our Archdiocesan Synod and to reflect on the next step for implementing the plan for our parishes.
