Homily Notes

Forgiveness, Reconciliation, Peace

Today's Gospel tells us about two apparitions of the Risen Jesus and of the gift of the Holy Spirit. the Risen Lord greets his disciples with the word "Peace", *shalom*. This means peace with God, peace in the heart, peace with everyone. Our world needs this gift of peace, not only in the Holy Land, and between Russia and Ukraine, but wherever there is conflict, in many countries of Africa and elsewhere, and even in our own country where many people are suffering on account of the dire economic situation.

Jesus repeats his greeting 'Peace'. Then he says: "Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven." This is Mercy, the goodness of God, always ready to forgive if we turn to Him. Jesus teaches forgiveness; he gave us the prayer "Our Father" where we say: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Forgiveness is the way to reconciliation, reconciliation the way to Peace. Forgiving is difficult, but we have the Holy Spirit to help us, giving us wisdom, understanding, courage and strength to bear witness to Jesus through our lives.

Thomas was absent the first time Jesus appeared. The disciples were closed in out of fear. Thomas then was not afraid. He could not believe the others when they said they had seen the Lord, but he did not cut himself off from them, nor did they cut him off. The next time the Lord appeared he was there, professing his faith: "My Lord and my God."

Jesus says: "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe." This applies to us. Let us pray that we may be strong in faith, full of mercy, ready to forgive, artisans of peace in our world.

Sunday Thoughts

I have an advantage that many of you in our Parish Community do not have. That is, I spent 22 years in Burkina Faso, where I was able to learn other values and other priorities for life and faith. That experience changed my soul.

I was reminded of this when I received pictures from one of my brother missionaries, Fr. Kariim Konseibo. His mission parish is the refugee camps of Maaji, Uganda, where he and 2 other missionaries serve some 35,000 refugees. The people who populate these camps have lost everything. Many have lost their families in the wars in Sudan and Somalia. They have nothing to stay for and nothing to go back to. Yet their faith in Christ, the Risen Lord, keeps them alive, gives them hope, helps them live in Christian communities that do what they can to relieve the sufferings of their fellow refugees.

They celebrated Christmas. They sang and danced in thanksgiving. These images remind me of how people throughout Africa are turning to Jesus in faith and hope. Their faith is both a comfort, knowing that God is with them in their terrible suffering, and also an encouragement not to give up in face of the crushing poverty and debilitating injustice that rob them of all their rights and the means to improve their situation.

Their faith-commitment is an example to us, who gather each weekend in our community, of what it is to be alive in Jesus, the risen Lord. Already we do much in our community to restore dignity to nature and to the people who are so misused and maltreated by the capitalist system that is robbing the poor to pay the rich. We recognise this in the works of Tuesday morning and the many hours put in preparing them; in the individuals who visit the sick and care for them, even when they are not of their own family; in the spirit of welcome that opens doors to new members of the community and to those who are only passing; in the care for each other; in the contributions to charities beyond our doors.

We give thanks to the Risen Lord for what He inspires us to do already and pray that we may respond more each day to his call.
