Homíly Notes

In our Christian community, that is the church, there are

two types of service needed; one is one of maintenance or, internal service and the other is mission or external service.

The first is for the good of the members of the community, caring for their needs and ensuring their wellbeing. It might include the service of prayer and liturgy, an essential part of Christian life. It would also include the physical needs of the members, as we saw in the care for the widows in the Acts of the Apostles. It might also include maintenance of buildings and structures that belong to the community for the good of all. It would certainly include teaching, ensuring that new members knew the teachings of the faith, what we would call today catechesis and preparation of the sacraments.

The second service, the mission, is that of going out and spreading the knowledge of the faith to others – to follow Christ's instruction that the Good News be taken to all corners of the earth. This too is essential for the healthy life of the community of disciples. This would mean in today's parlance, Justice and Peace work of the community, the engagement for the good of the local community and of the environment, it would mean caring for the poor and the excluded in society as a whole, not just the members of the Christian community: the work of CAFOD, for instance, of the SVP, or Aid to the Church in Need...

There is no shortage of places where we can engage our talents and interests for the good of the Christian Community and for the coming of the Kingdom.

What is clearly necessary is the need for us all to feel included in one way or the other in the daily life of the community. This is done through our prayer and devotions in support of the community and through giving time and support to the various needs of the church. In this way, we will be a light to the world around us shining in hope and joy for all to see.

Holy Communion

When Jesus celebrated the Passover with the apostles and his friends, he shared the blessed bread

and wine and said, "This is my Body. This is my blood". He told them to do the same in memory of Him.

When we celebrate the Eucharist (Holy Mass) we are doing it in memory of his Last Supper, his death on the Cross and his resurrection.

Christian teaching, from the beginning of the Church, has always taught that this bread and wine are, in reality, the body and blood of Jesus. Despite some Christians having developed other interpretations, we Catholics still hold tight to this belief.

The Eucharist is a meeting with Christ, alive and present in his assembled community, in the Word that we share and in Bread and Wine we take to eat and drink. All three aspects of the Eucharist deserve equal attention and appreciation. One does not surpass the other in importance and all are essential elements of the Eucharist.

For hundreds of years, the practice was to receive Communion with both elements; the bread and the wine. With the proliferation of numbers, it became difficult to give the wine as well as the bread and it became acceptable to receive full Communion by partaking of the bread alone. It was after the Second Vatican Council that the practice of receiving the wine too was reintroduced, out of a desire to follow more closely the actions and the words of Jesus at the Last Supper.

So, it's good and encouraging that from next Sunday we will be able to receive both the bread and the wine again at Communion. Understandably, some will hesitate, fearful of passing on or receiving a virus or other infection by drinking out of the same cup as another. Medical opinion is, apparently, that the risk is very low and that the renewed practice is safe. There is no pressure, however, for people to receive the chalice. The teaching of the Church is clear; the totality of Communion with Jesus is individually in both the bread and the wine. (Doctrine of Concomitance)

So, feel free to take the chalice as well as the bread offered by the minister, or to reverently walk past the chalice to return to your seat for thanksgiving. After Saturday and Sunday Mass next weekend, you are invited to stay, take some refreshment and get to know our fellow parishioners. This helps us to create a community spirit.
