Corona Thoughts

Over the past week, as the number of deaths in hospitals has decreased, thank God, the number of deaths in our nursing and care homes has been dramatically increasing. Media headlines have been warning us of worse to come.

Covid 19 has exposed a moral and pernicious problem in our society:

our attitude to the elderly and infirm; add to them the prisoners locked up in prison and the refugees hiding in curtained rooms and uninhabitable flats. In our eyes, in the Government's eyes too, top priority was given to hospitals and to primary care in the NHS. We failed to hear the cries of the Nursing Homes whose staff were without PPE. The prisoners locked up in their cells and the refugees hidden behind closed curtains did not even have a voice.

As we begin to see the light at the end of this tunnel, we cannot allow ourselves to go on ignoring this attitude. For far too long we have accepted that those who need care at the end of their lives are not our problem. We have accepted that prisoners locked away do not have the same rights as we. We turn our backs on the refugees and the poorest among us, convinced that their own choices brought their plight upon themselves.

In an article in the Tablet this week Shelagh Fogarty quotes the journalist Ian Burrell: "There was nothing inevitable about so many deaths in care homes. It is down to incompetence and a shamefully slow response. But it is also down to structural flaws in the way our society treats older and disabled people." Honour the old. Save the young.

What are we going to do about it?

Do not let your hearts be troubled, trust in God still and trust in me. Jesus spoke these words during his last supper with his disciples, the evening before his death. In the Gospel of John, during this Supper, Jesus gives a farewell speech and speaks openly about his death.

So we can imagine how the disciples feel at that moment: they are troubled because without Jesus their whole future is falling to pieces. Jesus tries to reassure them: *Do not let your hearts be troubled, trust in God still and trust in me.*

These days of the Corona virus, we too feel at times like the disciples: worried and troubled about our health, about our children and the elderly, our jobs and our finances.

While Jesus is saying farewell, he also makes his disciples a promise: I shall return to take you with me, so that where I am you may be too. Jesus is speaking about Easter, his resurrection. He says: On that day, you will know that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you.

The disciples do not need to be troubled that Jesus is leaving them, because he will return to live among them and in their hearts. The people of the Old Testament worshipped God in the Temple. Now, as believers in Jesus, we have become Temples, God dwells in our hearts.

Though we may be worried these days about the future, Jesus reassures us: *Trust in God still, and trust in me*. Jesus encourages us to trust in God who lives among us and in us, to trust in God who will give us the strength to face the future and overcome all that is evil.
